



Fashion Schooner (Walner-Broadway Schooner-Broadway Hall)

Racing in the second Hambletonian Oaks elimination on Saturday night, Fashion Schooner brushed to the lead out of third before the half, kept the top spot into the lane, and wound up second, half a length behind winner Warrawee Xenia and timed in 1:52.2 (28 second last quarter).

Fashion Schooner raced just three times as a 2-year-old with a best finish of third. This year, she hasn't missed the board in seven attempts (4-2-1 record). Her wins include a leg and the final of the New Jersey Sire Stakes and a division of the Del Miller Memorial at the Meadowlands. Overall, she has pocketed \$218,462 and has a mark of 1:50.1 taken in her Del Miller Memorial tally.

Quotes

Trainer Jim Campbell:

On the elim: "I was happy with her. You can't take nothing away from the filly that beat her, she came flying. I thought we had the race wrapped up, and that filly came flying from out of nowhere. The track was a little different [Saturday] than what it has been. The horses are coming from behind more than they have any night that I've seen for the most part this year. I wasn't disappointed in her. I thought she put in a good race. Tim [Tetrick] was happy with her. I hope we can work out a good trip in the final."

Only three races last year. “That was the hand we were dealt just because she got sick early. She just wasn’t set and ready to go when we tried racing her and the time off really helped her a lot. Coming back this year, she’s done everything and more that we could ask of her.

You never know how good one is going to be, but she showed us enough last year where we thought that if everything worked right for her, she had the ability to do it. She has high speed, she’s good gaited, gets over the ground good, and she’s got a good attitude. She likes to race.”

Breeding Notes

Fashion Schooner is from the sparkling first crop of Walner and is one of three finalists in the Hambletonian Oaks for him, joining Venerable and Warrawee Xenia.

Her dam, the Broadway Hall mare Broadway Schooner, won her elimination and the final of the 2009 Hambletonian Oaks. Broadway Schooner could become just the second mare to win the Hambletonian Oaks and then produce a Hambletonian Oaks winner. Currently, only Nan’s Catch, the 1988 Oaks champion and the dam of 1996 Oaks winner Moni Maker, has accomplished that feat.

Fashion Schooner is also a half-sister to Broadway Donna, an earner of over \$1.4 million who finished fourth in the 2016 Hambletonian Oaks final.

Fashion Schooner is a homebred for Jules Siegel’s Fashion Farms of New Hope, Pennsylvania. Jules Siegel, along with his late wife, Arlene, bred and owned Fashion Schooner’s dam Broadway Schooner, who as mentioned above, won the 2009 Hambletonian Oaks.

TIM TETRICK

Tim Tetrick won the 2012 Hambletonian with Market Share, trained by Linda Toscano. Market Share received divisional Dan Patch Award honors and finished second to stablemate Chapter Seven for Trotter of the Year.

Tetrick has finished second in the Hambletonian final on three occasions, with Spy Booth in 2021, Smilin Eli in 2013, and Crazyed in 2008.

He has two wins in the Hambletonian Oaks, with Bar Slide for trainer Joe Holloway in 2010 and Danae for trainer George Teague Jr. in 2007.

Tetrick ranks third in all-time driver purses with \$247 million. He led the sport in earnings in 2019 and 2018 as well as for seven consecutive years, 2007 through 2013. He has finished no worse than third in the money standings in each of the past 15 years.

Tetrick ranks seventh in career wins with more than 12,900. He was second in wins in 2021 with 658 and has finished among the Top 10 each of the past 17 years.

In 2007, Tetrick won a record 1,189 races and was named the U.S. Harness Writers Association's Rising Star Award winner as well as Driver of the Year. That season he became the first driver to lead the sport in both wins and purses (a then-record \$18.3 million) in the same year since 1991.

Tetrick was the regular driver of 2012 Horse of the Year Award winner Chapter Seven and 2019 Horse of the Year Award winner Shartin N.

He represented the U.S. in the 2015 World Driving Championship and finished third.

Tetrick grew up in Illinois and followed his father, Tom D. Tetrick, into the sport. Brothers Tom T. and Trace also are involved in harness racing. Trace is the all-time leader in driving wins at Hoosier Park.

JIM CAMPBELL

Jim Campbell won the 1995 Hambletonian with Tagliabue, driven by his brother John, and the 2009 Hambletonian Oaks with Broadway Schooner, driven by Brian Sears. He is one of 10 trainers in history to win both the Hambletonian and the Hambletonian Oaks.

Broadway Schooner and Tagliabue were Dan Patch Award winners for Campbell.

Both trotters were owned by the wife-and-husband team of Arlene and Jules Siegel. With Campbell guiding the Siegels' stable, the couple was the sport's Owner of the Year in 2002 and 2009. Jules was inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2018. Arlene, who passed away in 2010, was inducted into the Hall of Immortals in 2021.

Last year, Campbell finished fifth in the Hambletonian with Take All Comers.

Campbell has won more than 1,375 races lifetime and \$50 million in purses.

He followed his father, Jack, and grandfather, Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Famer Dunc Campbell, into harness racing.

Fashion Farms LLC., New Hope, Pennsylvania

Based in New Hope, Pennsylvania, Fashion Farms LLC. is operated by Jules Siegel, an inductee into Harness Racing's Hall of Fame in 2018. Siegel, along with his late wife, Arlene, won the 1995 Hambletonian with Tagliabue and the 2009 Hambletonian Oaks with Broadway Schooner. Dan Patch Award winners for the Siegels through the years have included Broadway Donna, Broadway Hall, and Galleria. With Jim Campbell guiding the stable, the Siegels were the sport's Owner of the Year in 2002 and 2009.
